

SILVIO BIANCHI MARTINI

Born in Lucca in January 1962, Silvio Bianchi Martini has been professor of business administration at the faculty of economics of the University of Pisa since November 2005.

He has also held a series of management and coordination positions at the University of Pisa, including director of the degree course in corporate strategy and governance, director of the master's course in auditing and internal control and the master's course in corporate strategy and governance. He is currently director of the Fibonacci post-graduate school of the University of Pisa.

From 1990 to 1998 he was a researcher in business administration and taught course in business administration, corporate strategy and policy and corporate quantitative methods and evaluations.

In the academic years 1998-2001 he was associate professor at the Bocconi University in Milan where he taught corporate strategy and policy for more than ten years.

He coordinated MBA courses at the Bocconi University in Milan (on behalf of Fiat Auto in 1999 and 2000).

He is a member of the *Accademia Italiana di Economia Aziendale*, the *Società Italiana dei Docenti di Ragioneria e di Economia Aziendale* (for which he has also been a member of the board of governors) and La Società Italiana di Storia di Ragioneria.

Over the years he has participated in numerous research projects, some of national significance, also in the role of coordinator.

He qualified as a chartered accountant in 1992 and was registered on the list of chartered accountants in Lucca in 1998. He has also been on the official list of registered auditors since it was formalised in 1995.

He is a standing statutory auditor of Mediaset (term ends with the approval of the 2010 Annual Report), chairman of the board of statutory auditors of Dada Spa, an independent director and chairman of the internal control committee of Molmed Spa, director of Banco di Lucca and a member of the control bodies of a number of industrial companies.

He was a member of the board of statutory auditors of Finecogroup SpA (from November 2002 to December 2005) and has also been a member of the board of directors of Capitalia SPA (from December 2005 to July 2007) where he was an independent director, member of the internal control committee and the remuneration committee.

He has also participated, as an expert, in commissions for the restructuring of debt and the commission for the privatisation of certain municipal pharmacies.

His professional commitments as a consultant have mainly been for the implementation of management control systems (both private and public), corporate and equity restructuring and corporate evaluations.

He is also the author of numerous studies.
